
Citizen Science

Mawson's Antarctica

Antarctica & Subantarctic Islands | 24 Days

Retrace the historic voyage of Sir Douglas Mawson's Australasian Antarctic Expedition (AAE) and experience the grandeur of remote East Antarctica. Cross the Antarctic Circle towards Commonwealth Bay and the fabled Cape Denison. Conditions permitting, make landfall to explore what remains of Mawson's main base, and find yourself transported back to the Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration. Keep watch for porpoising Adélie and emperor penguins, orcas patrolling for prey, and snow petrels soaring against the backdrop of the vast ice sheet.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Navigate through gleaming pack ice alive with Weddell and leopard seals, Adélie and emperor penguins
- Discover historic Commonwealth Bay as we attempt to make a rare and much-coveted landing at Cape Denison, the site of Mawson's Huts (ice and weather permitting)
- Skirt rowdy beaches crowded with harems of New Zealand Hooker's sea lions to reach gnarled rātā forests, where rare yellow-eyed penguins can be found

Macquarie Island is a remote subantarctic wonder teeming with unique wildlife and rugged landscapes. It is renowned as one of the most important seabird breeding sites in the world, with vast colonies of penguins, albatrosses, petrels, and other species congregating on its rocky shores. (Visit subject to permits.)

8-10 At sea.

When Captain John King Davis skilfully steered the *Aurora* through heavy pack ice in 1912, the Australasian Antarctic Expedition became the first to chart this stretch of coastline. As you sail into these waters over a century later, you are entering one of the most inaccessible and seldom-visited parts of Antarctica.

14-15 For many Expeditioners, approaching Commonwealth Bay, where Mawson and his men established their main base, evokes a profound sense of awe and humility.

16-19 At sea.

20-22 As we explore the New Zealand Subantarctic Islands, you will witness an ecosystem to an ecosystem populated by unique endemic species such as the yellow-eyed penguin and Campbell Island mollymawk.

Antarctica & Subantarctic Islands | From 25 Days

Step back into the Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration to discover a wildlife wonderland. As you journey south, spot yellow-eyed penguins and royal albatrosses on New Zealand's Auckland Islands and Campbell Islands. Crossing the Antarctic Convergence, enter pack ice alive with orcas, seals and emperor penguins. Our expedition days within the Ross Sea offer icy drama, rich wildlife experiences and extraordinary stories of human exploration and survival. These are indeed historic waters. Hear stories of the expeditions and explorers of the Heroic Age.

- Explore the world's largest body of floating ice, the Ross Ice Shelf, rising 30 metres from freezing waters patrolled by pods of orca
- Navigate through gleaming pack ice alive with Weddell and leopard seals, Adélie and emperor penguins, and whales feeding in fathomless depths

Subantarctic Discovery

Australia & New Zealand (Aotearoa) Subantarctic Islands | 15 Days

Perched on the Antarctic Convergence, Australia and New Zealand's Subantarctic Islands are home to some of the most abundant and unique wildlife on earth. New Zealand's Auckland Islands and Campbell Islands are home to the yellow-eyed penguin, sea lion harems and courting southern royal albatross. Experience the humbling majesty of Fiordland's deep sounds, and Zodiac-cruise the craggy coast of the Snares Islands, breeding grounds for the rare Snares crested penguin and Buller's albatross.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Explore the seldom-visited islands of the antipodean subantarctic, a sanctuary for millions of breeding albatrosses, penguins and seals
- Discover the delicate ecosystem of Campbell Island (Motu Ihupuku), where royal albatross nest amid fields of flowering megaherbs
- Skirt rowdy beaches crowded with harems of New Zealand (Hooker's) sea lions to reach rātā forests where rare yellow-eyed penguins can be found




