Our small-ship voyages are the ultimate holiday for lovers of spectacular coastal scenery, blue sky and fresh sea air. With no more than 34 guests, the ships feel more like private yachts, and fellow travellers soon become friends.

Idyllic coastal cruising

These holidays are relaxed and unhurried, and your captain will take every opportunity to help you enjoy the Croatian scenery, climate and crystal-clear sea. The sun deck offers a great vantage point for stunning views as you cruise between the mainland and islands, and whenever possible there will be stops in quiet coves for swimming off the ship.

Delicious, freshly prepared meals

Like all great holidays, mealtimes are a highlight of our small-ship cruises. As well as buffet breakfasts, most meals are included and freshly prepared on board and all the ships have a bar (some have a free bar at set times of the day). Meals on board are relaxed, with an open dining policy so you can choose where you sit, adding to the easy, friendly atmosphere. On some days you can go ashore to eat at a local cafe, bistro or quayside restaurant. Wherever you dine the food is delicious and often made with fresh produce that was bought the same day.

Experienced captain and crew

Whichever ship you sail on, you can expect genuine warmth and hospitality from your captain and crew. Most of the ships are privately-owned which really adds to the intimate and friendly atmosphere on board, and to the levels of service our guests receive. 
Amenities include a small reception, an open-plan dining room with seating and bar area, and a sun deck that features ample seating for all guests and is ideal for socialising and admiring the views.

Built in 2011 and refurbished for 2023, this stylish ship offers all the facilities of a modern yacht with a friendly small-ship atmosphere and is perfect for exploring Croatia's stunning coast and islands.

Sail with just 34 guests

Amenities include an outdoor shaded lounge area with tables and sofas, an air-conditioned restaurant/bar with panoramic windows, a spacious sun deck with jacuzzi and a swimming platform. The free bar is open 11 hours a day from 11am-10pm and serves local alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks.

Dining

The dining room is located on the Upper deck and is where meals are served. Buffet breakfasts include hot and cold dishes, and lunch and dinner are set menus.

Cabins

Comfortable, air-conditioned cabins. There is one Upper deck cabin with all other cabins located on the Main and Lower decks. Each has a safe, hairdryer and en suite bathroom with a shower cubicle, WC and a wash basin. Cabins on the Upper and Main deck are accessed from outside the ship. 


Dining

This sailing adventure takes us to the lesser-known islands, national parks and ancient walled cities of the north Dalmatian coast. Along the way we sail between the uninhabited islands of the Kornati archipelago, marvel at the tumbling cascades of Krka waterfalls and tick off an array of UNESCO wonders - including the Venetian charms of Zadar, the Roman ruins of Split and the medieval beauty of Trogir. Awash with days cruising on sun-bleached decks, this is the perfect balance of relaxation and discovery.

Day 1 UK - Split - Trogir. Our nationwide return chauffeur service collects you from home for your flight to Split. On arrival, we transfer by coach to Trogir and board our ship MV Amorena (4★).


Day 2 Krka National Park - Skradin. Today we start our journey up the north Dalmatian coast. Where the Krka River flows into the Adriatic, we sail inland - weaving our way beneath steep limestone cliffs and craggy bays to the pretty town of Skradin. The jumping off point for Krka National Park, one of eight national parks in Croatia, Skradin is full of charm - with red-roofed houses, a harbour lined with bobbing sail boats and a backdrop of forested hills.

On arrival we go on a guided walk to the famous Krka waterfalls - a beautiful landscape of seven waterfalls and emerald-green lakes. Carved into the limestone karsts over millennia by the rushing waters of the Krka River, the area is considered a natural phenomenon and has UNESCO status. We stay moored overnight in Skradin.

Day 3 Šibenik - Zadar. Sailing out of the channel, we stop at the historic town of Šibenik for a guided tour. Terracotta-topped houses, elegant Renaissance buildings and Gothic churches stack up on the hillside above the port. We stop to

admire architectural gems, including the Bishop's Palace, Ducal Palace and the town's crowning and UNESCO-listed glory - the 15th-century cathedral. Surrounded by 71 carved faces and topped by a Renaissance dome that dominates the town's romantic silhouette, the cathedral is thought to be the world's largest stone-built church.

Continuing up the coast, we arrive in the ancient city of Zadar where we moor for the night.

Day 4 Zadar - Telascica. Croatia's longest continually occupied city openly tells the story of its past, as 16th-century Venetian fortifications sit alongside 9th-century Byzantine churches, ancient Roman forums, and 1960s modernist flats. Referred to as the 'Dresden of the Adriatic', the city was heavily bombed in WWII by the Allies - destroying up to 80% of its buildings. Many have been beautifully and sympathetically restored, but the architectural landscape of the city bears both its scars and its spirit. On a guided tour we weave our way through the streets of the old town, stopping to admire the Morska vrata (Sea Gate), the Romanesque-style St Chrysogonus Church and baroque St Simeon Church.

Back on board, we sail to the bay of Telascica on the island of Dugi Otok and dock overnight.

Day 5 Kornati National Park - Vodice - Zlarin. Today we set sail through the Kornati Islands - an archipelago of over 140 uninhabited desert-like islands and islets, peppered with caves and grottoes and wrapped in otherworldly blue waters.

Camera batteries fully exhausted, we sail to Vodice - a popular seaside town where we'll briefly step ashore before cruising south to the island of Zlarin where we moor for the night.


Day 6 Primošten - Split. On our way south to Split, we sail past picturesque Primošten. With crystal-clear waters, golden beaches and a sun-faded old town clinging to the coastline - Primošten is the manifestation of Mediterranean charm.

Arriving in Split, we step ashore for a guided walking tour. Croatia's second largest city started out life in AD 295 as the retirement palace for the Roman emperor, Diocletian. UNESCO-listed Diocletian's Palace still stands at the heart of the old town and houses some of the best-preserved Roman ruins in the world.

Over the centuries, the city expanded into a maze of narrow medieval streets and Gothic archways scattered with Roman ruins. There's free time to wander Split's waterfront or stroll to one of the city's squares. We stay moored here tonight.

Day 7 Trogir. Sailing back to where we started, we'll arrive in Trogir. Linked by bridges to the mainland, this beautiful city's wide seafront promenade of classic Venetian façades hides a maze-like old town of medieval streets dotted with churches and Renaissance buildings. We head out on a guided tour of the UNESCO-listed old town past Romanesque-style cathedrals, Venetian palaces and Benedictine monasteries, before returning to the ship for our final night and farewell dinner.

Day 8 Trogir - Split - UK. We transfer to the airport for your return flight to the UK. Upon arrival, your vehicle will be waiting for the journey home.

Bookended by the medieval-walled city of Dubrovnik and the stylish city of Split, we spend a week cruising along the forest-draped bays, hidden beaches and rustic fishing villages of the Dalmatian coast. On board our comfortable ship, we moor up in cosy harbours to explore some of the Adriatic's most famous islands - including Hvar, Korčula, Brač and Mljet. Discovering Roman ruins, Gothic cathedrals and jumbled old towns, we return each time to the sun deck, Jacuzzi and en suite compact cabins of our ship.

Day 1 UK - Dubrovnik - Sipan. Our nationwide return chauffeur service collects you from home for your flight to Dubrovnik. On arrival, we transfer to the port and board our ship MV Liberty (4★). Lord Byron famously described Dubrovnik as the 'Pearl of the Adriatic'. Knowing we'll be back to explore in a few days, we watch from the decks as the famous terracotta rooftops and medieval ramparts of Croatia's most enchanting city retreat behind us.

Cruising north beneath the pine-shrouded hillsides of the Dubrovnik Riviera, we arrive at Sipan - the largest of the Elafiti Islands and a peaceful retreat covered by olive groves and vineyards. We moor for the night opposite Sipanska Luka - a horseshoe-shaped lagoon with stone houses and colourful fishing boats.

Day 2 Korčula. Today we cruise past the Peljesac Peninsula - a slender stretch of vineyard-covered land that juts out from the mainland to almost touch the shores of our next destination, the island of Korčula. The island is said to be the birthplace of explorer Marco Polo. Whether true or not, the Venetian-style buildings, Renaissance colonnades and palm-dotted waterfront of Korčula Town make it another jewel on the Dalmatian coast.

Arriving late afternoon, we moor up for the night - going ashore on a guided tour to explore the cobbled alleyways, churches and clock towers that jostle for space inside the city's medieval walls. Known as the 'wine island' there's free time to sample the local goods before heading back to the boat for the night.



Korčula



Day 3 Makarska - Pučišća. Continuing to hug the Dalmatian coast, we stop at Makarska - a popular beach town sandwiched between a palm-lined promenade and the slopes of the Biokovo mountains. We arrive at the island of Brač by late afternoon, a much sleepier island than its neighbour, Hvar. We moor in Pučišća for the night, often listed as one of the prettiest villages in Europe and the centre for the island's century-old craft - stone carving. There'll be time to explore the scenic streets and squares and visit the stonemasonry school for a demonstration.

Day 4 Split. We continue our voyage to Split, Croatia's second biggest city that spreads out in layers from the waterfront through an old town tangle of ancient alleys and Roman ruins, communist-era Brutalist blocks and circling mountains beyond.

Starting out life in AD 295, the city grew out of the now UNESCO-listed Diocletian's Palace - home to some of the best-preserved Roman ruins in the world. It's now a 1,700-year-old treasure trove of Roman, Venetian, Ottoman and Byzantine influences, which we'll see on our guided tour.

Day 5 Hvar. Heading south we cross to Hvar, Croatia's sunniest island that needs little introduction, with yacht-filled azure waters and polished marble streets. Arriving mid-afternoon, we take a short walking tour of the 13th-century walled city, passing by Gothic churches and café lined piazzas. There's free time to explore,

perhaps climb up to the Spanish Fortress for sweeping views. Or maybe walk along the seafront to the 15th-century Franciscan monastery, home to an impressive mural of the Last Supper.

Day 6 Mljet. Today we sail to Mljet. Carpeted in thick forest and dotted with lakes and vineyards, this is one of the Adriatic's most alluring islands. With scenery that sparked Greek epics, it's said that Mljet is the paradise island of Ogyia in Homer's Odyssey. We moor here tonight, wrapped in the peace and tranquillity of Mljet's pine-shrouded slopes.

Day 7 Dubrovnik. Passing by hidden coves and wooded inlets, we cruise between the Elafati islands on our way to UNESCO-listed Dubrovnik. Cirled by grand city walls, bastions, towers and fortifications, the old town is a maze of white-stone houses, sun-burnished orange roofs and baroque churches. On today's guided tour we'll pass by Sponza Palace, one of the few buildings that survived the 1667 earthquake that destroyed much of the city. Like walking through a medieval filmset, we also visit Dubrovnik Cathedral, Rector's Palace and Onofrio's Fountain. We enjoy our final night on board with a farewell dinner.

Day 8 Dubrovnik - UK. We transfer to the airport for your return flight to the UK. Upon arrival, your vehicle will be waiting for the journey home.

Known for their healing Mediterranean climate, ruggedly beautiful landscapes and translucent waters - the Kvarner Islands in northern Croatia manifest the laid-back Mediterranean lifestyle perfectly. Dotted with olive groves, vineyards and forest-backed beaches, we sail between all four of the islands - stepping ashore to explore sleepy hilltop villages, weave our way through the medieval alleyways of small coastal towns, and toast the beauty of the Adriatic with cold glasses of Žlahtina - the local straw-coloured white wine.

Day 1 UK - Zagreb - Opatija. Our nationwide return chauffeur service collects you from home for your flight to Zagreb. On arrival we transfer to the Opatija Riviera where we board MV Dalmatia (3★).

Day 2 Opatija - Cres. We sail this morning to Cres. One of the largest of Croatia's 718 islands, Cres is also one of the least developed with its thick forests, olive groves and rocky hilltop villages. Adding to its undiscovered and remote charm, the island is also home to 80 breeding pairs of rare griffon vultures - which we keep watch for as we skirt the island's rugged shoreline.

We moor up in Cres Town, jumping ashore for a guided walking tour. Cres may only have 3,000 permanent residents, but it has a heavyweight history - with buildings, churches and ruins cataloguing its Roman, Byzantine and Venetian occupation. We stay moored here for the night.

Day 3 Cres - Susak - Mali Lošinj. We sail this morning to Susak, one of the smallest of Croatia's inhabited islands - just 4 sq km in size. Weather permitting, we'll take a short walk on this car free island, carpeted in herbs and trees, and circled by golden sandy beaches - it's a true taste of unspoiled Croatian island life.

Then we sail east to the island of Mali Lošinj, whose crystal-clear waters were felt to give the island unique healing powers. A health resort for the Habsburg Royal Family in the 19th century, 200 years later the island is having a wellness revival, with travellers visiting for the clean water, medicinal herbs and warm climate. We dock in the main town of Mali Lošinj. Remnants of its grand Venetian past, the pastel-painted facades and sun-faded clocktowers make it one of the prettiest harbours in the Adriatic. We go ashore to explore the town and take a guided tour of the Garden of Fine Scents - a walled garden of over 250 species of herbs and medicinal plants that naturally grow on the island.

Day 4 Mali Lošinj - Ilovik - Rab. Sailing onwards this morning, we head towards the small island of Ilovik. We'll make a short visit after lunch (weather permitting). We'll then spend the rest of the day making our way to Rab, the greenest and best known of the Kvarner Islands. Rab fits the archetypal Adriatic paradise perfectly - jade green waters, verdant hillsides and a red-roofed old town that looks straight out of a story book. We moor here overnight.


Day 5 Rab. Dominated by four bell towers, Rab's ancient walled town bears the beauty of its changing hands over the years - with Byzantine churches, elegant Italianate mansions and Romanesque towers to explore. After a walking tour, the afternoon is free to wander independently or soak up the city's crumbling Venetian charms from the ship. Perhaps visit the House of Rab Cake, home of the delicious spiral-shaped cake made mainly from almonds and Maraschino liqueur, first served in 1177 to Pope Alexander III.

Day 6 Rab - Krk. We head towards the former prisoner island of Goli Otok this morning where we'll make a short visit (weather permitting) and explore a little before continuing to Krk. Here, we enjoy a guided walking tour of the old town - now a familiar but still magical mix of Venetian buildings, Franciscan and Benedictine monasteries and fortified castles.

We then travel by coach to Vrbnik, a medieval hilltop village whose silhouette is defined by its soaring Renaissance bell tower. As well as being one of the most picturesque villages in Croatia, Vrbnik is also known for Žlahtina - a white wine grape grown exclusively on the island. We tour a family-run winery and sample some of the goods before heading back to Krk Town where we stay moored for the night.

Day 7 Krk - Opatija. We sail towards Opatija, a summer resort town built in the 19th century for Habsburg royalty. Our ship remains in port overnight.

Day 8 Opatija - Zagreb - UK. This morning we enjoy a walking tour of Opatija and learn about the town's history. There is free time to explore, before we transfer to the airport for your return flight to the UK. Upon arrival, your vehicle will be waiting for the journey home.

You'll have time to wander Split's waterfront or stroll to one of the city's squares before dinner is served onboard tonight.

Day 2 Split - Trogir. Diocletian's Palace sits at the heart of Croatia's second city. Originally built as a retirement palace for a Roman emperor, it's been added to over the centuries to create what you'll see today - a beautiful maze of medieval streets, Gothic archways and Roman ruins. We'll explore as part of our guided tour of Split, learning more about how the palace has evolved and how locals have squeezed shops and cafes into old cellars, arches and courtyards.


Later, we set sail along the coast to the pretty town of Trogir. Musicians will join us on board for an evening of traditional entertainment.

Day 3 Trogir - Primosten. This morning, we take to the marble-paved streets of Trogir's UNESCO-protected old town for a guided tour on foot. Connected to the mainland by a bridge, it's a wonderful jumble of palaces, churches and monasteries, with a grand Venetian cathedral keeping watch over everything.

We then continue to sail northwards, hugging this beautiful stretch of coastline, to picturesque Primosten where we overnight.

Day 4 Krka - Vodice. We venture inland this morning, sailing up the Krka River to the pretty town of Skradin. We continue back to the mainland to the coastal city of Zadar. On a guided tour, we'll learn about Zadar's rich past as we make our way through the streets of the old town. We'll stop to admire the Morska vrata (Sea Gate), the Romanesque-style St Chrysogonus Church and baroque St Simeon Church, as well as the famous sea organ, which uses the motion of the waves to create music.

Day 6 Rab. 🗺️ Our captain will plot a course for the lush islands of the Kvarner Gulf today. First stop: Rab. Probably the best known of the Kvarner islands, it boasts sandy beaches (a rarity in Croatia), green hillsides (likely to be carpeted in wildflowers at this time of year) and a medieval town with a quartet of campaniles (bell towers)

studding the skyline. A guided walking tour reveals Italianate mansions and Romanesque towers; afterwards, you'll have time to wander at leisure.

Day 7 Krk - Opatija. The next port of call on our Croatian cruise is Krk, the largest island in the Adriatic. Go ashore and explore a little or stay on board and enjoy a relaxed morning ahead of our final sailing back to the mainland.

Our final stop is Opatija. This magnificent coastal town was once a well-known 19th-century health resort for Austro-Hungarian aristocracy and nobility, so you'll spy lots of grand, stately architecture.

Day 8 Opatija - Zagreb - UK. Our Croatia cruise comes to an end today. We disembark this morning and transfer to the airport for your return flight to the UK. Upon arrival, your driver will be waiting for the journey home.


