“Another planet”

As guide and expedition leader for PONANT EXPLORATIONS, Vadim Heuacker has spent many summers in the Arctic, particularly in Greenland. His many passions include exploring, sharing his knowledge in the field and offering unique experiences. Very much in line with the itineraries we offer in this region in 2027.

"The Arctic summer is a magnificent season. The tundra – a typical landscape whose existence many travellers do not even imagine – is in bloom. The days stretch on, and while watching whales in the evening, it is not uncommon to see the sun's rays piercing through their spray.

"The stark landscapes of Iceland are the perfect gateway. Surrounded by vertiginous cliffs that are home to puffin colonies, Grímsey Island has one foot inside the Arctic Circle. In Svalbard, you come directly into the heart of the High Arctic and its glacial scenery. Three-quarters of the archipelago consists of protected areas offering guests ample opportunity to observe birds and marine mammals, especially walrus.

"As for Greenland, it boasts some of the most varied and spectacular landscapes in the Northern Hemisphere. I particularly enjoy introducing people to Akulleq, a unique place. Ochre hues, sparse vegetation and a fjord dotted with icebergs creates a striking contrast of colours. You feel as though you are on another planet. Encounters with Inuit communities happen naturally, in a climate of trust, creating unexpected bonds with guests.

"Of all our itineraries aboard the Sisterships, the Northwest Passage is the best route for reaching the wild High Arctic, where the greatest concentrations of bears can be found, as well as belugas, narwhals and musk to name a few. We organise a wide range of activities that allow visitors to observe them, whilst tracing the history of the explorers.

"To the west, in the Canadian Arctic, the vegetation is sparse and the landscapes are gentler, more mineral. Heading south towards Labrador, then Newfoundland, you can admire the transition between tundra and boreal forest, and witness the meeting of black bears and polar bears. These multicultural regions are very rich in history, from the Vikings to whalers, including the Inuit communities of Nunatsiavut. Further south still, the Gulf of St. Lawrence is a haven for cetaceans. Last year, we had the fortune to observe three North Atlantic right whales, one of the most endangered species in the world. A true privilege!"

1. Goðafoss: the fall of the pagan era

The Goðafoss waterfalls were once the setting for a pivotal event. In the year 1000, Thorgeir, one of Iceland's chief governors, cast his pagan idols into the swirling waters, sealing the conversion of his people to Christianity. The name of the waterfall literally translates as 'waterfall of the gods', and preserves the memory of this moment.

2. Wild encounters in Spitsbergen

This end-of-the-world setting sees the Svalbard reindeer living alongside the Arctic fox, prowling near the cliffs, as well as numerous bird species, including the ever-present Arctic tern. At sea, walrus and seals can often be observed. The polar bear is more elusive: keep your eyes open if you hope to catch a glimpse of one...

3. In the footsteps of Paul-Émile Victor

Paul-Émile Victor described Greenland as "the most beautiful place in the Arctic". On the west coast, the giant 4.5 km wide Eqi glacier was one of the main landmarks for the French explorer. The site still houses the refuge from which he launched his polar expeditions in the 1950s to study the ice sheet.

4. The remains of the Franklin expedition

The Northwest Passage still bears the mark of the epic journey of British explorer John Franklin. Attempting the crossing in 1845, his ships, the *Erebus* and the *Terror*, were trapped in the ice for over a year off the coast of Nunavut, before disappearing. Their wrecks were only found in 2014 and 2016, 100 km apart. The final chapter of their story has yet to be written...

5. The animal kingdom of Ungava Bay

In the heart of Nunavut, the imposing limestone cliffs of Akpatok Island provide an ideal haven for Brünnich's guillemot – *Akpat*, in Inuktitut. In this uninhabited territory, wildlife reigns supreme, with polar bears roaming the rocky walls, while walrus and seals bask on the beaches.

6. Boston, the city best explored on foot

Nicknamed America's Walking City, its European look and rich heritage attract travellers from around the globe. Boston is best discovered along the Freedom Trail, which leads through the charming cobbled streets of Beacon Hill and past the famous Quincy Market, where you can enjoy delicious lobster rolls.

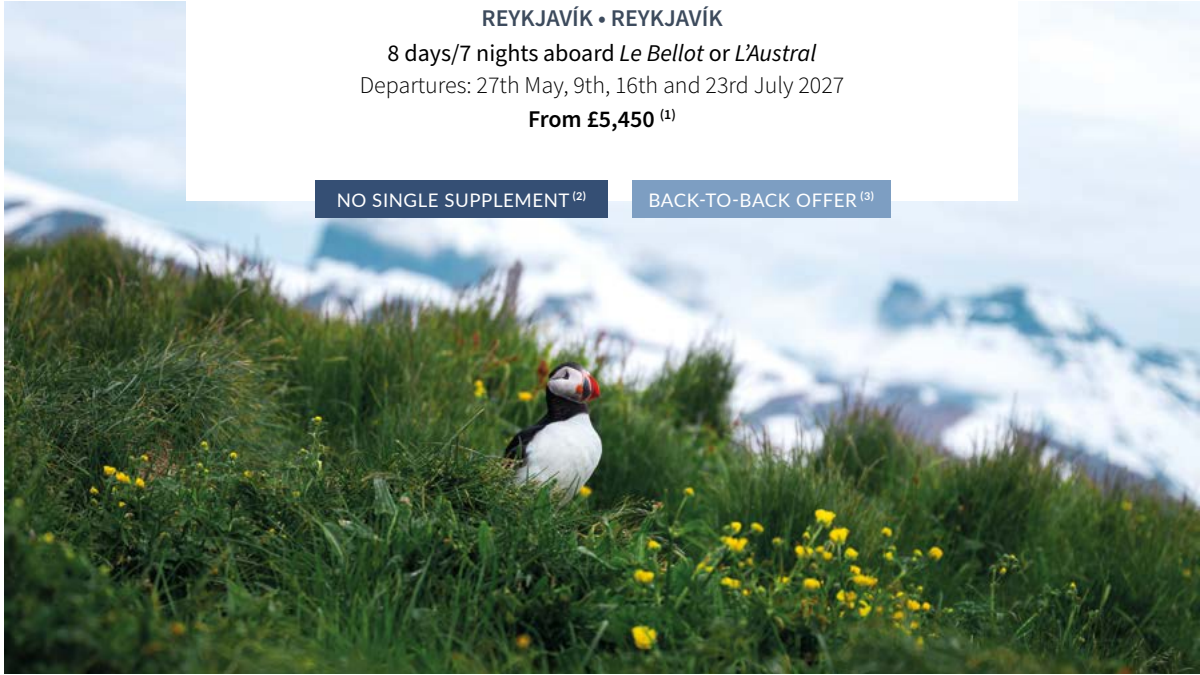

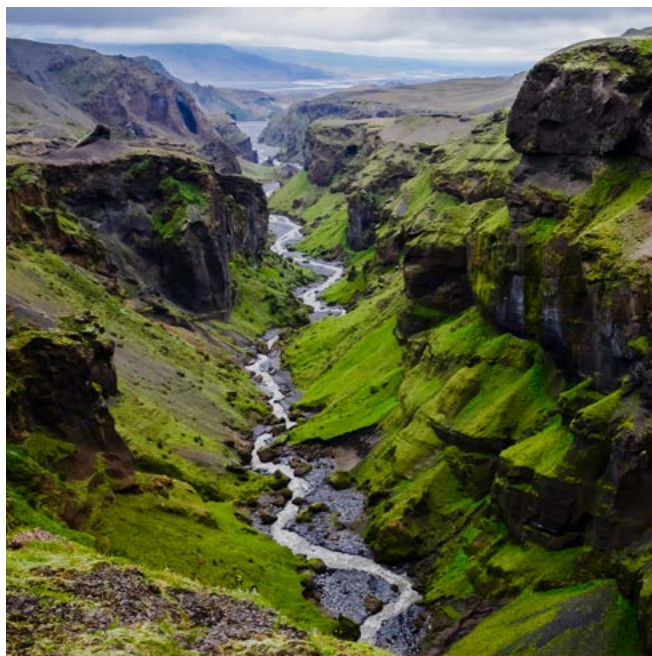

Then explore the natural pool of Brimketill, shaped by volcanic activity and influenced by the tides, followed by the geothermal area of Krýsvík, dotted with hissing fumaroles and hot springs in shades of turquoise and rust, and finally Lake Kleifarvatn, reflecting the Icelandic sky. A stay at the Iceland Parliament Hotel offers the opportunity to enjoy the capital by night.

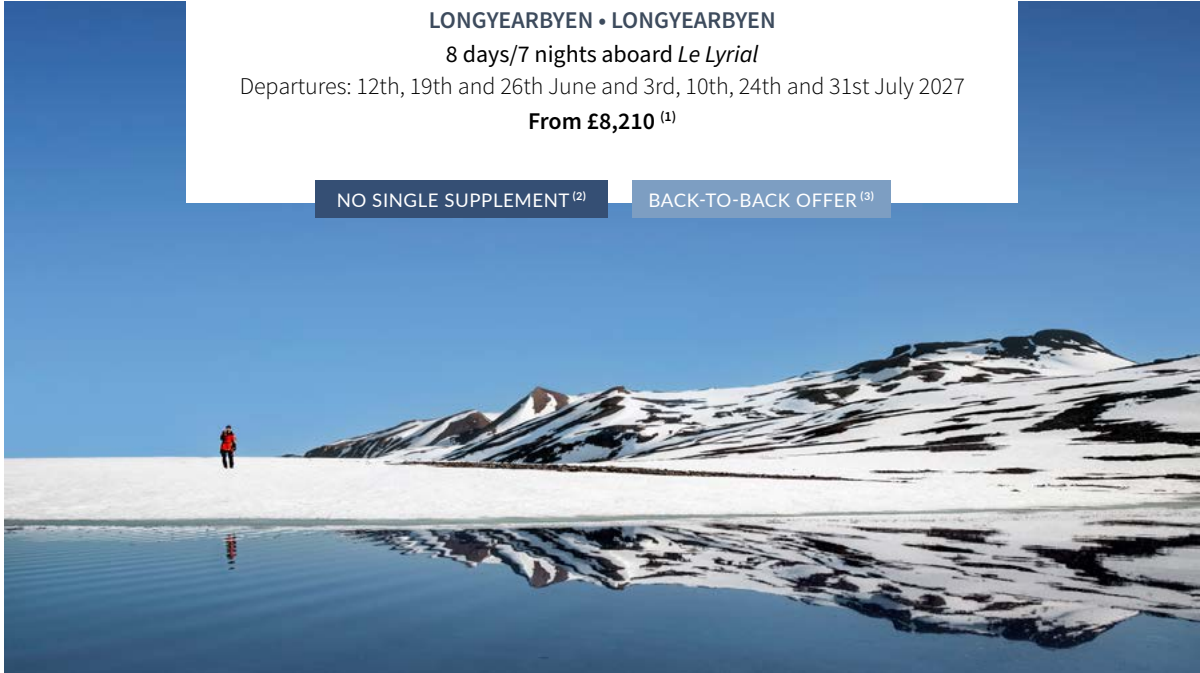

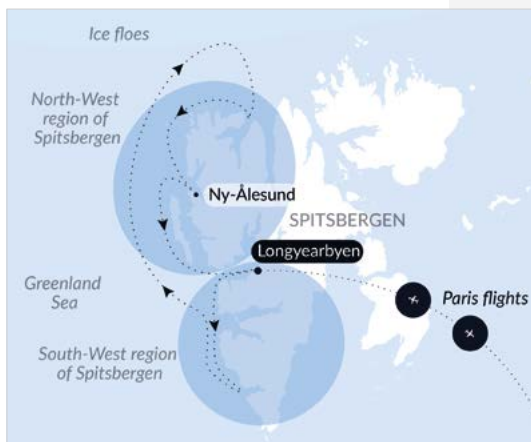

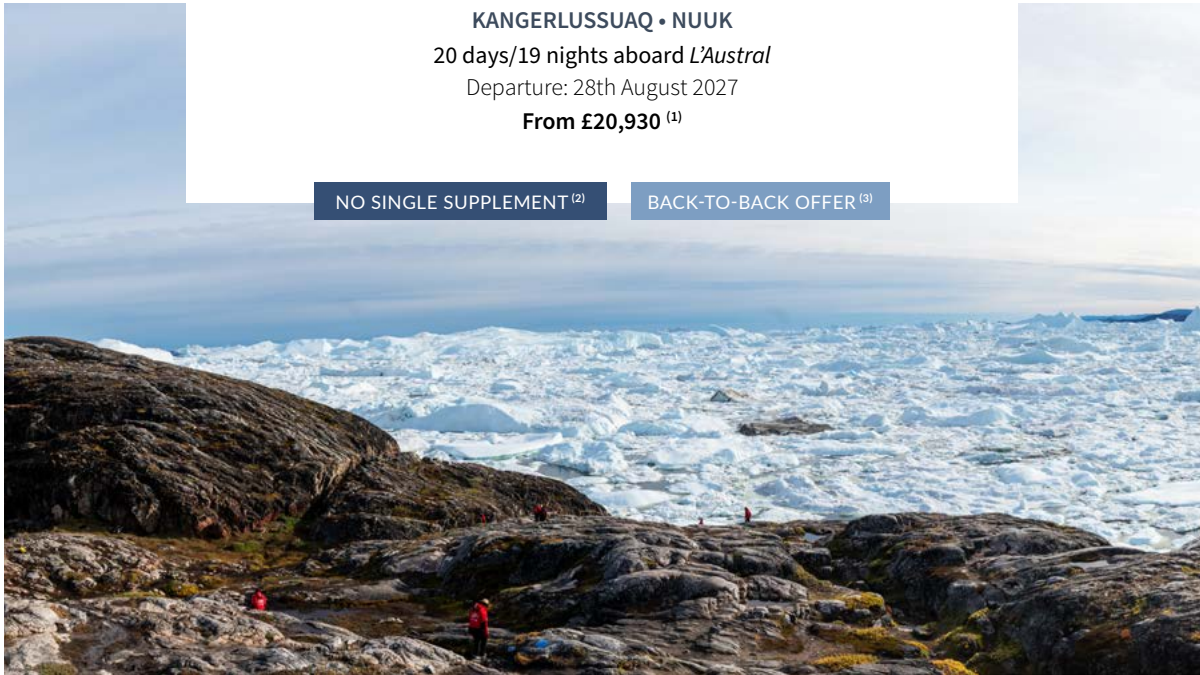

An unwavering respect for life

As a field anthropologist and lecturer-guide, Christiane Drieux has been exploring the most isolated regions of Greenland for almost 25 years. Drawing on her encounters with the Inuit, she delivers a sensitive reading of their communities, where tradition, transmission and adaptation are all rooted in a close relationship with the living world.

"Among the Inuit, the bond with the environment remains particularly strong. Although the populations of the west coast now live in towns and villages, these remain small islands of habitation within a vast area. As soon as conditions allow, families head out to sea, go camping, or set off to hunt caribou or seal... A style of living in the world takes shape here, founded on the idea of a continuity between humankind and nature.

"This continuum is reflected in particular in the place given to dogs. Around Disko Bay, they are no longer essential to survival –as they still are further north among the Inughuit– but many still maintain a small pack, as they have done for centuries. This is due to the unwavering respect for life, for others, for animals and for nature, and is what unites these communities. A stranger is first and foremost seen as a traveller, to whom particular attention and a special welcome are extended.

"Collective life is organised around these same principles of mutual support. In winter, a continuous sequence of visits takes place during the *kaffemik*, in which people share a coffee, sometimes without even speaking, simply in order to face the harshness of the polar night together. And when a hunt or a fishing trip is successful, it gives rise to literal feasts, sometimes lasting several days, where the instinct is to share rather than to store. This readiness to welcome abundance without guarding against scarcity reflects a confidence in the return of resources.

"Beyond change, what remains is this ability to combine openness to the world with a deep attachment to the environment, rooted in pride in their Greenlandic identity, their culture and their ancestors."
