“Regions teeming with life”

Captain Tristan Muzika, at the helm of *Le Champlain* for the past two years, joined PONANT EXPLORATIONS in 2021 to be part of “a remarkable human experience”. His enthusiasm for the Caribbean and Central America – where he has been sailing for a long time – is contagious. Here, he shares his favourites for the 2026–2027 season.

“Colours, scents, warmth... The Caribbean and Central America are ideal destinations for chasing away the winter blues. The shallow draught and size of our ships allow us to anchor in remote locations, such as Chatham Bay on Union Island, or the lush island of Coiba in Panama, before landing our guests on deserted beaches for unique experiences. One of these takes place on the island of Mayreau, where the culinary team organises a barbecue featuring an abundance of fresh, local produce.

“In Central America, I anticipate an early start to the day with a zodiac outing to observe the wildlife present along small rivers, such as the Río Esquinas. We then offer excursions beneath the canopy of primary forests, in protected reserves and national parks, to encounter spider monkeys or capuchins, parrots, coatis or raccoons. These regions are teeming with life.

“Crossing the Panama Canal is legendary and a privilege. Few travellers ever get to navigate it. Beforehand, excellent speakers prepare our guests for this crossing and then, live on the ship, our local guide shares their knowledge and anecdotes. Their presence is invaluable, while the crew remains fully focused on the manoeuvre. One of our most popular stops is Playa Muerto, in the province of Darién. There, we meet the Emberá community. Between the rolling waves of the Pacific, the villagers guide our zodiac pilots to help them come ashore, and, on arrival, the children accompany us to the ceremony organised in our honour.

“Our ports of call, designed on a bespoke basis, as well as life on board, are guided by a spirit of friendliness, fostered by the small-ship atmosphere. I like to compare my role to that of a conductor, setting the rhythm for a highly qualified and passionate team in order to ensure the satisfaction of our guests.”

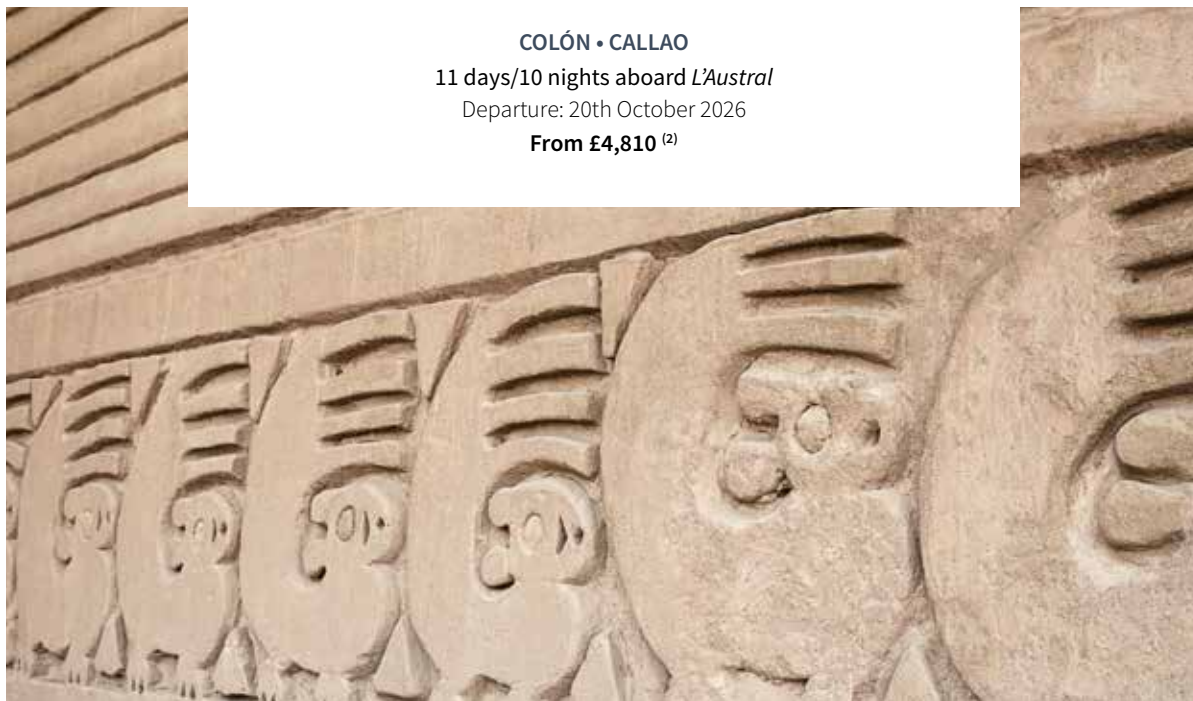

At the gates of Darién National Park, emerging from calm waters, the stilt village of Playa Muerto reveals itself, as if suspended between the water and the trees. This is where the Emberá live, an indigenous community whose daily life is intimately linked to the rainforest.



Every gesture tells a story: the *jagua* body paintings, applied with precision, mark the bodies as symbols of tradition and identity. Hands patiently work natural fibres, transforming ancestral gestures into everyday objects or works of art. Dances and songs set the rhythm of village life, celebrating nature and the bonds that unite each inhabitant to their land.

Walking through this village, listening to the laughter and songs, observing the gestures and rituals, is to immerse oneself in a profound and rare experience, where nature and culture respond to each other in perfect harmony.

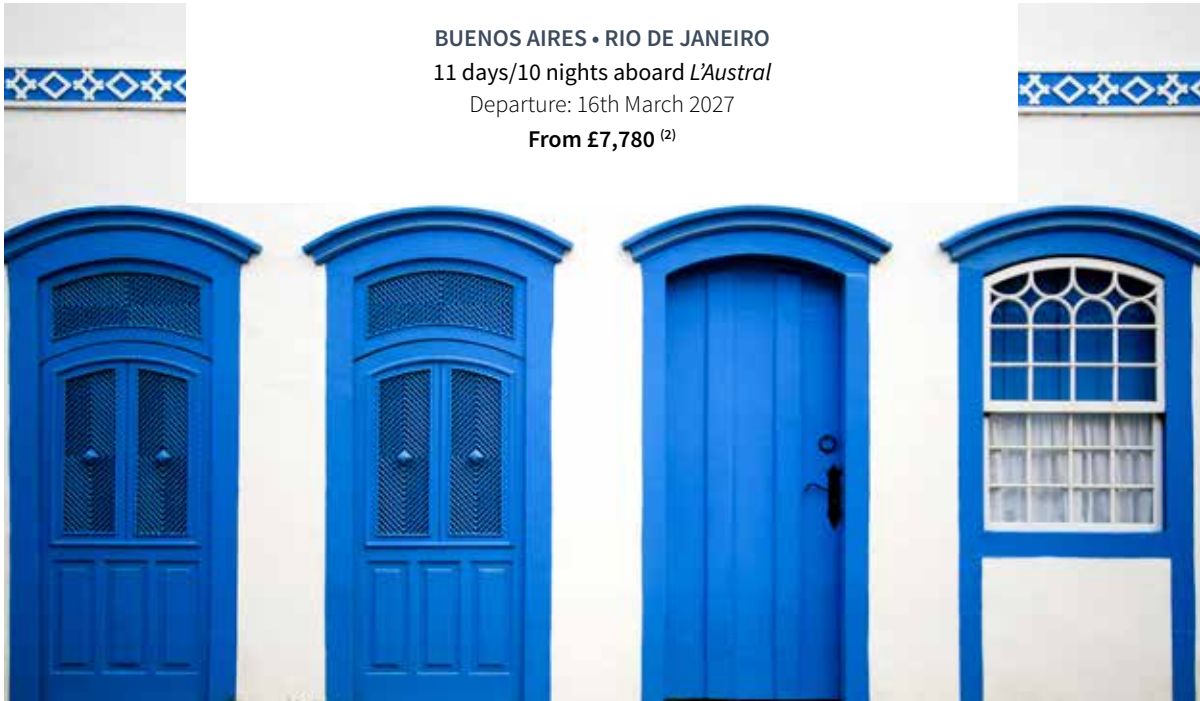

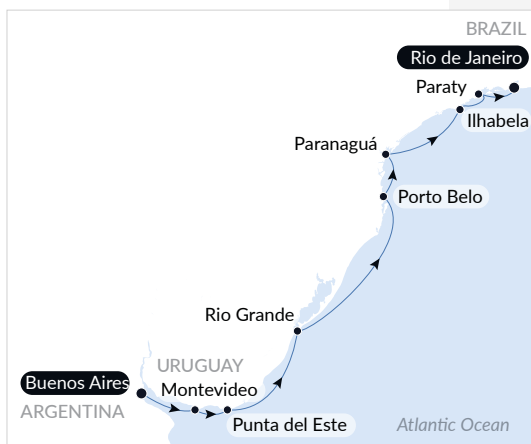

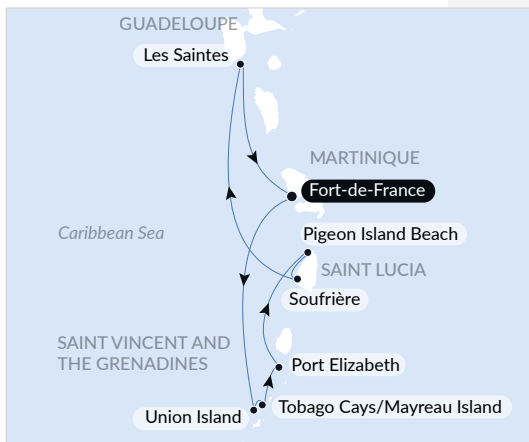

Azure horizons, disconnecting in the Caribbean

As Europe plunged into winter, Cathy Bou flew to the Caribbean with her family in December 2025 for her first cruise with PONANT EXPLORATIONS. Each island they visited revealed its own unique identity, evoking a world of emotions and a profoundly exotic experience.

“Before departure, we imagined the Caribbean as a backdrop of beaches and coconut trees. This trip revealed much more to us. Approaching these islands by sea, aboard *Le Bougainville*, allowed us to grasp their depth, and above all their contrasts. It is a region rich in nature, history and culture, which we were able to explore at each stopover, but also learn more about through lectures given on board: the spice route, piracy, the colonial past... It captivated us all, including my 10-year-old son.

“I fell in love with Les Saintes, which revealed an even more authentic side of Guadeloupe than I already knew. In Dominica, the lush vegetation left me speechless, while in Saint Lucia, we were swimming in a dream. Throughout the trip, the beaches kept changing; the landscape transformed, the villages came alive, and the light evolved. Nothing was linear, except for the change of scenery, which was incredibly gentle.

“Although the programme seemed dense, it was in fact perfectly balanced. In the morning, for example, we could enjoy the sun and discover the seabed while snorkelling at our own pace, then in the afternoon, we could treat ourselves to a more active outing to a volcanic site or a chocolate farm. We were constantly in balance, both completely disconnected and fully immersed in discovery.

“After a week, when it was time to leave this ship that had been our cocoon open to the sea, I was moved to tears. A first for me, despite my many travels.”

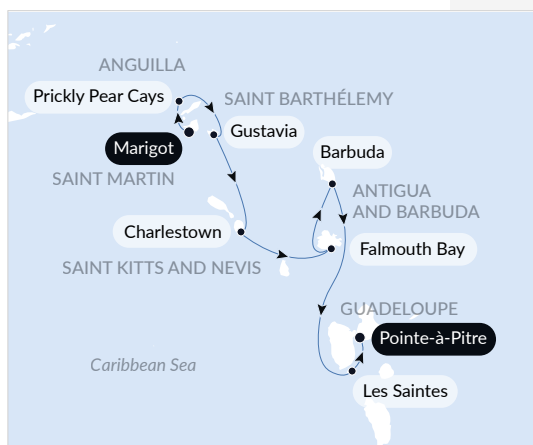

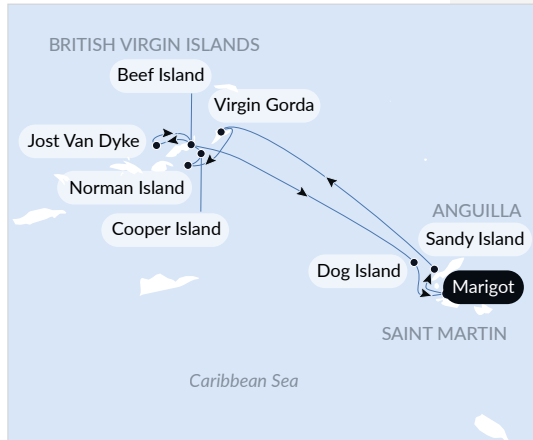
